

CoNaKa: Covid-19 resilience in Armenia and Georgia and Nagorno-Karabakh conflict response

PROGRAMME PROFILE

Overall objective:

To mitigate the impacts of Covid-19 on the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Armenia and Georgia

Specific objective:

Increased resilience of Covid-19 affected people in Armenia and Georgia, of those displaced from the Nagorno-Karabakh Conflict Zone and of host population in Armenia.

Target groups:

Covid-19 affected persons, people displaced after NK escalations, people hosting displaced persons, most vulnerable people incl. people with disabilities such as wounded soldiers in Armenia.

Duration:

40 months, May 2021-Aug. 2024

Austrian Development Agency with the funds of Austrian Development Cooperation, Austrian Red Cross, Caritas Austria and Hilfswerk International

Lead and implementing partner:

Armenian Caritas, Armenian Red Cross Society, Georgian Red Cross Society, IDP Women's Association "Consent" in partnership with Austrian Red Cross (lead), Caritas Austria and Hilfswerk International

PLANNED RESULTS AND ACTIVITIES

Expected Result 1: Disaster Relief

12.920 Covid-19 affected people in Armenia and Georgia, most vulnerable local population in Armenia and Georgia and NK conflict affected people (8.238 female, 4.682 male) in Armenia will receive humanitarian assistance in form of cash support, food and hygiene parcels.

Expected Result 2: Gender-sensitive psychosocial support services (PSS)

3.260 particularly female caregivers, Covid-19 and NK conflict affected people (2.115 female, 1.145 male persons) will receive PSS and HR-capacities in gender-sensitive PSS in local partner organizations in Armenia and Georgia will be strengthened.

Expected Result 3: Employability

3.245 Covid-19 and NK conflict affected people incl. 1.880 women and 1.365 men will strengthen their ability to participate in the labor market, find jobs and create businesses in Armenia and Georgia.

Expected Result 4: Health Care Services

420 persons incl. 263 older women and 157 older men will receive increased access to Covid-19 sensitive health care services and professionally led healthy-ageing activities in Armenia and Georgia.

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
